





Landscape Architecture in Warsaw

As a landscape architecture student, having the opportunity to explore the urban planning and landscape design in a large European city under the guidance of my two supervisors was an amazing opportunity









Landscape Architecture in Warsaw






The next project was called CoAdapt and involved collecting data from local estates to use in creating a game that would teach sustainable urban development








Travel and culture was an important part of my visit. Poland is a country with very rich history and the people are deeply connected to it.


Everywhere you go you can find historical artifacts and architecture, with countless museums and beautiful nature.






















































My summer at SGGW was truly unforgettable and I can't wait to come back to Poland to see everything I missed and reunite with the amazing friends I made there.
