



Calendar for the 2021/2022 academic year for full-time studies






Virtual Dean's office/On-site Dean's office

SGGW has a Virtual Dean's office that allows students to access their data 24/7. Each faculty also has on-site Dean's offices where you can get information on important matters, such as class schedules and semester grading rules. Electronic student ID card

In order to obtain an Electronic Student ID Card, you must log in to the Virtual Dean's office (ehms.sggw.edu.pl) and pay the relevant fee to the account indicated in eHMS. The photo for the ID card is taken from the student recruitment database. Each Dean's office will set a deadline for collecting ID cards. In general, a personalised ID document is produced within approximately two weeks after payment is recorded in the student's eHMS account.

The Electronic Student ID Card is also used as a SGGW library card, a computer access card, and a Warsaw City Card (for public transport).




Required trainings for students

Upon enrolment, each student is informed by the Office of Student Affairs about the required Library Training, Training on the Rights and Obligations of SGGW Students and Occupational Health and Safety Training.

These training sessions are held remotely on the https://szkole-nia.sggw.pl training platform, where students can learn how to use the SGGW Main Library collection and acquaint themselves with the campus rules and regulations and the principles of occupational health and safety in an accessible and comfortable way. You do not need to sign up for these training sessions. These are required and each student will be informed of them in an email.

Note: You only have to attend the Library Training, Training on the Rights and Obligations of SGGW Students and Occupational Health and Safety Training once during your course of study.

Activation and access to Office 365

Microsoft 365 enables students to access their e-mail, to attend remote classes and required training and to send questions and requests to the Virtual Dean's office. In order to activate your account, please go to https://konto.sggw.edu.pl/, select the 'I forgot my password' option, and then enter the e-mail address provided when registering for studies. You will receive an e-mail with a link to reset your password.

To access your e-mail account in Office 365 via a web browser, log in at: https://poczta.sggw.edu.pl.

Student e-mail addresses have the following format: sXXXXXX@ sggw.edu.pl where XXXXXX is the student record number preceded by enough zeroes to form six total digits. For example, the address for record number 1999 would be s001999@sggw.edu.pl.

WI-FI

SGGW provides students with access to the EDUROAM (Education Roaming) Wi-Fi network. The network is available in all dormitories and in most buildings on campus.

NETWORK NAME: eduroam

LOGIN: e-mail address - individual student record number preceded by the letter 's', e.g., s12345@sggw.edu.pl,

PASSWORD: the same as for your student e-mail account.

There is also a Wi-Fi network in the Student Dormitories on the main SGGW campus.

To use the Wi-Fi, please select the wireless network with your dormitory name (e.g., Dendryt). Then enter your SGGW mail login and password, e.g., s123456@sggw.edu.pl for a student. Once the login has been accepted, a network connection should be established.

Main Library and Academic Information Network

The Main Library is located near dormitories, together with the libraries of the Institutes, it forms SGGW's Academic Information Network.

The most important databases with access to over 300,000 books and journals and 170,000 other documents, an open Wi-Fi network (BG_SGGW), and a traditional collection of over half a million volumes attract everyone who wants to broaden the knowledge they acquire at lectures and during exercises. Students can borrow books from the lending library. Your student card is also your library card.

Students can use six reading rooms, each with a different function to meet the specific needs of its readers. The staff of each unit pro-

vide training for students, researchers and teachers on how to use the Academic Information Network resources most effectively.
